214.1 PUBLIC HEARING - TO CONSIDER AMENDMENT OF INGLEWOOD MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 2-190 THROUGH 2-2000 - ORDINANCE NO. 00-15 INTRODUCED. The City Clerk announced that the next scheduled matter was a public hearing to consider amending the City=s purchasing procedures by increasing the dollar limits for competitive bid procedures, that notice of this hearing has being given in the time, form and manner as required by law, the affidavit was on file and no communication was received on the matter.

The City Administrator submitted background information dated September 19, 2000.

Mayor Dorn ordered the report dated September 19, 2000 received and filed.

Ed Johnson, Acting Purchasing Manager, commented that the consumer price index had increased over 25% since 1991 and the proposed ordinance is an attempt to raise the dollar limits for purchasing procedures to bring the City in line with today=s dollar index. He also noted that a survey was done of neighboring cities prior to presenting this matter to Council.

Mayor Dorn inquired if there were any persons present who wish to address the City Council on this matter.

Council Member Fernandez inquired about the process followed by staff when a project goes out to bid. He commented that for individuals working in large organizations, whether city, state or school district, this issue takes away from the flexibility and noted that there must be some control. He further commented that many organizations have a \$50,000 amount that the department head can purchase from and noted that in Inglewood, this needs to be adjusted.

Ed Johnson, Acting Purchasing Manager, explained the 4 categories of the City=s purchasing procedures (no bidding required, 3 phone/fax bids, informal bidding, informal bidding not requiring publishing and formal bidding requiring publishing), the process for the various amounts, the time span involved and advertising.

Council Member Kirkley commented that he would like to increase the phone/fax quotes category maximum amount from \$9,000 to \$15,000.

No other persons wishing to address the City Council on this matter Mayor Dorn declared the public hearing closed at the hour of 7:12 p.m.

It was moved by Council Member Kirkley and seconded by Council Member Fernandez that the amount of the phone/fax quote category maximum be increased to \$15,000. Subsequent to discussion, Council Member Kirkley withdrew his motion.

Council Member Horton commented that Didi Hirsch Community Health Center is a recognized non-profit organization and is requesting that the California Statewide Communities Development Authority issue tax-free bonds on their behalf in an amount not to exceed 1.5 million dollars. In addition, he commented that this had no financial impact on the city or will the city have any liability. He further commented that it is important to point out that the City of Los Angeles has concurred with issuance of the bonds and noted that this a procedural act as required by the Joint Powers Agreement of which the city is a member. He noted that Didi Hirsch was in the audience as well as representative, Michael La Pierre, to address any concerns.

Dr. Kita Curry, Didi Hirsch, thanked Mayor and Council for hearing the matter and extended thanks on behalf of the clients the organization serves. He commented that the refinancing could reduce the interest expense paid by 3 per cent resulting in additional resources becoming available for patient care.

Mayor Dorn inquired if there were any persons present who wish to address the City Council on this matter.

Reeva Williams expressed her dislike for placing persons in mental institutions without their knowledge.

Sylvia Hawkins congratulated Mayor and Council for supporting Didi Hirsch noting that she felt it was a good cause.

Mike Stevens inquired if the California Statewide Communities Development Authority was a state agency and if it was, why a public hearing was being held. He also commented that it was amazing that money could be found to help everyone except the taxpayers.

Council Member Fernandez commented that he felt that Didi Hirsch is a great organization and that it is sad to hear the comments being made. In addition, he pointed out that the organization has been helping many people in the city and region for many years and felt that the City is doing the right thing. Finally, he commented that it was of no cost to the city and the city is benefitting from the service.

Mayor Dorn commented that this organization has been on the front line for many years and has helped many young people in need of assistance. He pointed out that the city has nothing to do with the money involved with the organization including the financial aspect but note that this procedure would place the city in a position where it could continue to benefit from its services. He questioned how someone could be against a program that was of no cost to the city.
