Roosevelt Douglas spoke concerning the low morale at the senior center because of the delays in building their new center. He requested that Council Member Morales write a letter of thanks on behalf of District 3, to Steve Bradford of Southern California Edison for his assistance in helping the residents following the power outage last December.

Marilyn Douroux spoke concerning the improvements in Inglewood including the Marketplace and the new refuse collection contract. She commented that there is a problem in her neighborhood where transients dig through the receptacles and this discourages residents from recycling. She suggested that the city publicize how residents can eliminate the problem and still encourage residents to recycle. She further commented that the Marketplace is very beautiful shopping area but the parking needs to be completed because it is very congested, and there is a lot of panhandling in the area, which discourages shoppers.

Willie Agee commented that it is because of the Mayor and the City Administrator that the City is moving forward, and not because the City Council is doing a good job supporting their special interest groups. He further commented on the low union wages and encouraged the public to participate in the upcoming April election.

Gil Mathieu spoke concerning the rules of decorum and encouraged the Mayor to stop allowing individuals to disparage certain Council Members. He commented on the residency requirements which should continue as long as the individual holds a particular office. He inquired when a RedFlex report will be available, and he congratulated the entire City Council for the position they have taken with regard to the airport expansion.

Diane Sambrano spoke concerning the Kennard design proposal which was not a competitive bid which limits the recourse the City has. She commented on the huge effect LAWA has on the City, but still no one on the City Council is representing the residents with regard to the airport expansion. She further commented that the EIR recently passed helps developers but does not help Inglewood residents, and one only needs to look at campaign statements to see what special interest groups are getting the contracts.

Milton Brown announced that he will be filming most of candidate sessions held at the forum session at no expense to the city because each candidate deserves to get their message across. He commented that a public service announcement as suggested by Ms. Douroux would be a very good way to inform the public of the recycling policies. He thanked the City Administrator for his role in making Inglewood television a place where information may be found on the good things going on in the City.
