Dale Giovanni encouraged all the residents to get involved with neighborhood watch groups.

Raynald Davis spoke concerning cameras to monitor illegal waste dumping. He hopes the cameras will monitor criminal activity and be placed in certain locations in the city. He also thanked the City Council on a good job bringing Madison Square Garden into the City of Inglewood.

Theola Gardner commented on trust issues and the City Council and also the Council's inability to answer questions presented by residents.

Leroy Fisher asked the City Council to please pay attention when residents are addressing the Council. He also commented cameras should be in neighborhoods especially in District 1 where there have been many break ins.

Ethel Austin commented on a check on the warrant registrar for payment. She also commented on the Inglewood News not being circulated in her community.

There being no further business to be presented, Mayor Butts declared the meeting adjourned the hour of 10:09 p.m.
