Theola Gardner, District 1 resident who has lived in the City of Inglewood for fifty one years and have seen a lot of changes, a beautiful City destroyed. She stated there are no more Sears, J.C. Penny's and movies now there is nothing but a swap meet.

Gil Mathieu commented he is optimistic about the City of Inglewood. He commented the residents and Council Members have come through worst things than the City's current status, and the City will be ok. He also encouraged the City Council to have a town hall meeting to discuss the Successor Agency.

Ethel Austin commented on the Express Car Wash at Arbor Vitae and La Brea. She asked the City Council to look into this car wash. She also commented on a problem with Sizzler in District 1 and with Madison Square Garden coming please try and clean-up the Sizzler.

Kevin Monk Representative of SEIU 721, commented he is concerned with the City of Inglewood outsourcing union jobs. He also commented he would like an opportunity to talk to the council about all possibly solutions that will not include outsourcing.

Lynette Lewis commented previously the audience on Tuesday night has not been allowed to talk about people on the dais, now this has become a habit and this behavior needs to stop. She also commented we need to keep our residents who work for the City of Inglewood.

William Widener commented on a city notice he received for a broken window. He also commented he is seeking assistance from the RSI Program to replace all the windows at his home.

Dean Dhain a worker in the Public Works Department commented on the irrigation that was removed at ED Vincent Park to prepare for the soccer field and dumpsters at the City Yard filled with play ground equipment waiting to be installed. He stated these projects are frozen because workers have been cut.

There being no further business to be presented, Mayor Butts declared the meeting adjourned in honor of Austin Glenn, Jr. the hour of 9:52 p.m.
