PH-1. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT

Public Hearing under the Tax Equity Fiscal Responsibility Act (TEFRA) and the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, in connection with the proposed issuance of one or more series of revenue bonds by the California Municipal Finance Authority (CMFA) to assist in the financing or refinancing of the acquisition, rehabilitation, improvement and equipping of the Eucalyptus Park Apartments affordable senior rental housing facility located at 811 North Eucalyptus Avenue, Inglewood, California. (Tax-Exempt Bond Financing)

Recommendation:

- 1) Receive public input; and
- 2) Adopt TEFRA resolution to approve the financing of the project by the California Municipal Finance Authority (CMFA).
