

This camp is designed for students in grades K- 6, ages 5 to 12. EDUCAMP has partnered with the Inglewood Parks, Recreation and Community Services Department and the Inglewood Police Activities League (IPAL) to offer a pilot program that will provide academic enrichment in the morning and recreation in the afternoon.

Camp runs Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Before and After Care is available from 7:30 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Students will receive academic enrichment including; Reading, Writing, Grammar and Mathematics, Monday through Thursday from 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Lunch time is from 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. Fridays are reserved for field trips and special activities.

The recreation component of the camp will run from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and will provide a variety of fun and exciting activities including, arts and crafts, sports, outdoor activities, swimming and field trips (two per session).

This camp is designed to provide enrichment and fun to youth ages 5-12. Through instruction and application, campers will receive academic enrichment, social building skills, as well as, character development. Each week campers will focus on a different theme and participate in activities relating to the topic. Campers will also engage in a variety of structured activities including, sports, arts and crafts and interactive play.

#### Session I

<u>Week 1</u> – **Getting to Know You** – Campers will participate in a variety of games and activities including, ice breakers, creating group banners and making friendship bracelets.

<u>Week 2</u> – **Math Counts** – This week campers will engage in a variety of lessons and activities that will review and reinforce essential math concepts and skills.

<u>Week 3</u> – **Fairy Tales** – Campers will enhance their literacy skills by reading books and performing skits from their favorite fairy tale story books.

Week 4 – Space Is the Place – This week campers will explore the moon, stars and planets. They will make their own telescopes and prepare themselves for an imaginary outer space adventure.

Week 5 – Character Counts – Campers will focus on character building and will learn the Six Pillars of Character which include; trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship.

Week 6 – Simple Solutions – This week campers will have fun while reviewing mathematical skills in the kitchen. They will learn how to convert measurements and calculate ingredients.

<u>Week 7</u> – **Reading Is Fun** – Campers will participate in group activities and exercises this week that will focus on increasing literacy skills.

<u>Week 8</u> – **Mad Science** – This week campers will discover the tools for being a good scientist as each group is challenged to create their own experiment. Campers will culminate the final week of camp with a Science Fair.


