LEAD WEB DEVELOPER

DEFINITION

Under general supervision, design and build web-based software solutions to include project planning, creation of formal specifications, application development, solution implementation, documentation, quality assurance, and training.

ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS

TASKS

Maintain, analyze, and solve technical problems with the City's Intranet and Internet websites; Administer and maintain content management and delivery software (Civica). Develop, administer, maintain, and support systems applications and content delivery to City staff and the public. Develop project plans, formal specifications, documentation, and distribute tasks to and oversee the work of other web developers, programmers, analysts, and consultants as required. Create and manage databases, tables, queries, stored procedures, reports, and connections to web applications; Develop and enforce technical and style standards as they apply to the web.

Create, monitor, and prepare web server usage statistics and other reports. Serve as a key role assisting staff in developing and publishing web content including support of the design of department websites; Troubleshoot, resolve and repair problems on internet and intranet sites; consult with users to identify concerns and implement changes to improve service; respond to inquiries regarding internet or intranet concerns or questions.
