### **What is the African American Eye Disease Study (AFEDS)?**


- The African American Eye Disease Study is a study led by the University of Southern California (USC), Keck School of Medicine with funding provided by the National Eye Institute.
- The purpose of the study is to learn more about eye health in African American adults aged 40 years and older living in Inglewood so that programs can be created to help African American communities, both here and nationwide.

### **What does participation involve?**

- Participation is voluntary. Full participation entails being interviewed by a field interviewer at a time convenient for you and having your eyes examined at the AFEDS clinic by a fully licensed eye doctor.

### **Study participants will receive:**

- A free comprehensive eye exam by a medical doctor who is an eye specialist.
- A summary of your results, which you can give to your eye doctor.
